

CFPA Audition Tips: Be Seen. Be Ready. Be You.

1. Show Your Personality

Let us see your character shine through, even when introducing yourself.

Smile, use your eyes, and engage with your whole face - facials matter!

We want to see you step into the role, not just recite lines.

2. Bring Confident Energy

Walk in like you're excited to be there (even if you're nervous).

Stand tall, speak clearly, and avoid swaying or fidgeting.

Use purposeful pauses when reading lines or singing - they help us hear your story.

3. Be Prepared

Know the show. Know the character. And practice ahead of time!

Rehearse your scene or song in front of the mirror, with family, or with a friend.

You don't have to memorize the piece - but the better you know it, the more personality you can bring.

4. Dress Smart & Sharp

You don't need a costume, but dress in a way that shows thought and effort.

Clean clothes, brushed hair, and confidence go a long way.

Let your outfit 'hint' at the vibe of your character without going full costume.

5. Prep Your Voice & Body

Rest well the night before. Avoid dairy and sugary drinks before singing.

Warm up gently: sighs, lip trills, light scales.

Hydrate early - don't wait until right before you sing!

6. Understand Casting

Casting is about building the whole show, not just finding the 'best' actor.

We're looking for chemistry, voice types, age range, height, and more.

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Everyone at CFPA is in the show. Your job is to bring your best to every role - and that's how you get remembered for next time.

7. You Are Always Auditioning

In rehearsals, in class, backstage - how you show up matters.

Be helpful, teachable, and positive. Directors notice kindness, focus, and consistency.

Bottom Line:

- * Treat every audition like a mini-performance.
- * Treat every role like a chance to grow.
- * Be someone we want to work with - again and again.
